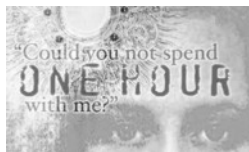


C o f f e e morning and raffle after the 10.30 Mass on Sunday the 23rd October. All proceeds

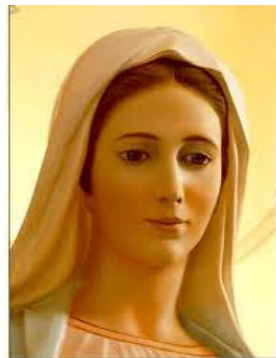
