18th Sunday of the Year

My dear people,

Many of us have now enjoyed one of the new generation of 3D films such as *Up, Piranha,* or *Toy Story 3*. They are so realistic that it is easy to forget you are simply in the dark watching a movie. Many of the pagan beliefs contemporary with the Letter to the Hebrews were based on the experience of exciting rituals conducted in darkness or by fire or water, even on hill tops in the midst of storms! The experience of these rituals must have made a very deep impression on the believers, and appeared to confirm the bogus beliefs they were taught. Today's second reading explains that faith in Jesus is based on truth, not on the experience of the senses because they can be so very misleading; like 3D films they are only imagination.

The Christian faith is grounded in a deeper experience of God which we know in quiet prayer and contemplation, in celebrating the Sacraments, and in faithful response to his call to holiness. This September we will be greatly blessed by the Pope's visit. This time of blessing should stir us to greater efforts to grow in faith, but we won't grow unless we give God the time to love us into holiness. We have many opportunities in our parish to help us in our journey of faith besides the faithful celebration of the Mass - our monthly celebrations of Mass or Benediction by candlelight at St Teresa's offer a beautiful time of quiet with the Lord. From this September we will also be able to spend a quiet hour at St Pius X, with Exposition and Benediction after the Thursday Mass once a month. Having trouble reading your Bible? This great treasure of the Church draws us ever deeper into the heart of God, so we are pleased to be able to begin a new course in Bible reading and study. Learning more about our faith helps us to understand more fully the mind and heart of God, and also helps us to teach and guide others in the faith. This year we have the great opportunity to learn with the people of Ss Peter & Paul Hockley; as they continue their exciting journey towards full communion with the Catholic Church, they will need our help and guidance, so taking part in this year's RCIA will be a valuable time of growth for us as well.

I hope and pray that this coming year will see all of us growing together in holiness and faith.




